OWERTY Shift and CAPS

Most keyboards use the QWERTY character layout, named for the first 6 letters on the keyboard. It was designed in 1873 by Christopher Latham Sholes of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. It is the most popular layout in use on computer keyboards and typewriters in the English language.

Trace over the keyboard characters which are shown as they would appear when the SHIFT key is pressed. Use a dry erase crayon or dry erase marker. Sharpie Medium Point Permanent markers can also be used; wipe the board clean with a paper towel and rubbing alcohol.
